THE Board of Trade have received through the Foreign Office a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, forwarding the subjoined Extract from the "Journal Officiel" of the 12th instant, relative to signals to give warning of the probable approach of bad weather, which are in future to be exhibited under the direction of the Préfecture Maritime of Rochefort.

Extract.

En conséquence, M. le Préfet Maritime à Rochefort a été autorisé à prévenir les navigateurs et les pêcheurs du 4e arrondissement du *mauvais temps qui semblera les menacer*, toutes les fois que les avertissements de tempêtes probables, reçus de Londres, seront d'accord avec les propres prévisions de l'Observatoire de la Marine à Rochefort.

Signal avec le Cylindre.

Quand, dans une station (poste sémaphorique ou outre), on aura reçu un télégramme de la Préfecture Maritime de Rochefort, on le fera connaître en hissant un *cylindre* et en affichant la dépêche explicative, s'il y a lieu.

Le cylindre signifiera par lui-même : *On prévoit du mauvais temps à Rochefort.*

Il restera hissé pendant quarante-huit heures, et sera amené au bout de ce temps, à moins que le Préfet Maritime n'en décide autrement.

Quand il est hissé, le *cylindre* paraît sous la forme d'un *carré noir*, quel que soit le point duquel on le regarde.

Interprétation du Signal.

Il est bien entendu que le cylindre ne prédit pas le temps ou le vent qui doit régner : il a pour but seulement de prévenir qu'il y a quelque part une perturbation atmosphérique qui peut atteindre le lieu où le signal est hissé, et dont la connaissance peut être utile aux marins de cette partie de la côte.

On rappelle ici que l'on ne peut faire connaître, par ce moyen, que les perturbations atmosphé-

riques les plus grandes et les plus générales. Les changements locaux d'une moindre étendue peuvent être signalés à l'observateur attentif par ses propres instruments et par les signes du temps, généralement bien connus des marins de chaque localité.

Le signal du cylindre a donc pour véritable interprétation : "Veillez, le mauvais temps peut atteindre le point où vous êtes."

Ce signal est complètement indépendant des signaux quotidiens du temps de la localité, que les sémaphores continueront de faire.
