TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Securities Office, Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, on Friday, 7th June 1985 at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000

2 The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 10th June 1985 to Friday, 14th June 1985 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date

3 The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England

4 Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent (being a multiple of half of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates

5 Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker

6 Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in
